The Old Saw Evolves

The Old Saw has been the Guild's newsletter almost since the founding of the organization. The first newsletter was published in August, 1990. By the spring of 1991, the "Communication" letter was re-branded as "The Old Saw" with Jon Siegel as the first editor. Fast forwarding to 2008, we were printing 180 pages spread over five issues each year. That was the last year we actually printed a general newsletter. The feature articles went to The Journal and over time, guild communication and the calendar went online. TouchUps became the de-facto newsletter. The Old Saw moved online and was published somewhat sporadically.

We began printing again in 2015 but this time with a new mission—a focus on Guild business. Printing enforced a schedule by publishing and mailing in the same envelope with The Journal. However this year, the money for printing has dried up. So the Old Saw goes back to being online only. And we realized that Old Saw material needed to be published more frequently.

Our answer is to publish one article at a time in PDF form as they become available. This will be branded as "Old Saw Articles" and will predominately focus on Guild business as we have for the past year.

A [new page on the website](#) hosts each numbered article presented as an individual PDF file along with a short teaser. You can read the PDF online or print it yourself. Most articles



can be printed double-sided on a single sheet of paper. There is enough margin to three hole punch if you wish. There is some color in each article but they will print black & white just fine.

The new web page has been seeded with the 18 articles from 2015. We will use TouchUps to bring new articles to your attention as they come online throughout the year. All past Old Saw issues going back to 1990 remain archived on the website. We expect to make everything searchable in the future. ●
